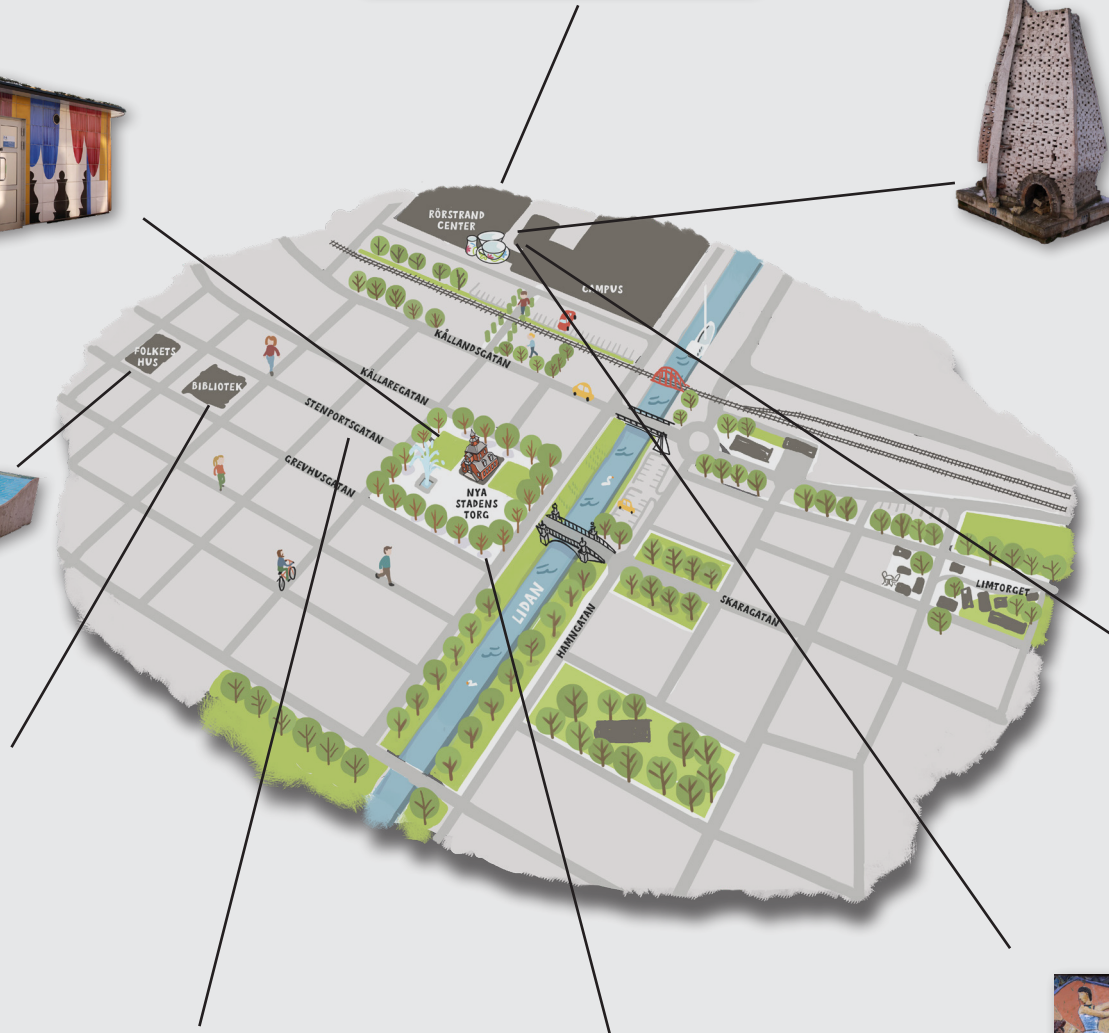


Design walk

Lidköping has a long tradition of design, with many innovative creators who have worked here in the past and many who are doing so now. Walk through the heart of Lidköping exploring the town through its decorative ceramics. Start with a visit to the Rörstrand Museum.

1. Rörstrand Museum

Discover the history of one of Europe's oldest china manufacturers with collections spanning three centuries. The museum displays popular dinner service designs, art ceramics, sketches, beautiful faience ware, tools and a round kiln. Rörstrand Center



6. Floating Scenery

Designed by Anna Elzer Oscarson, Floating Scenery was unveiled in 2016. Anna drew her inspiration from the rich colours of the countryside of Västergötland. Nya Stadens torg 5, between H & M and Nordea



2. Framsteget

Danish artist Nina Hole works with large earthenware sculptures fired on the spot where they are going to stand. Earthenware from 2008. Rörstrand Center



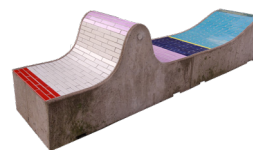
8. Library entrance
